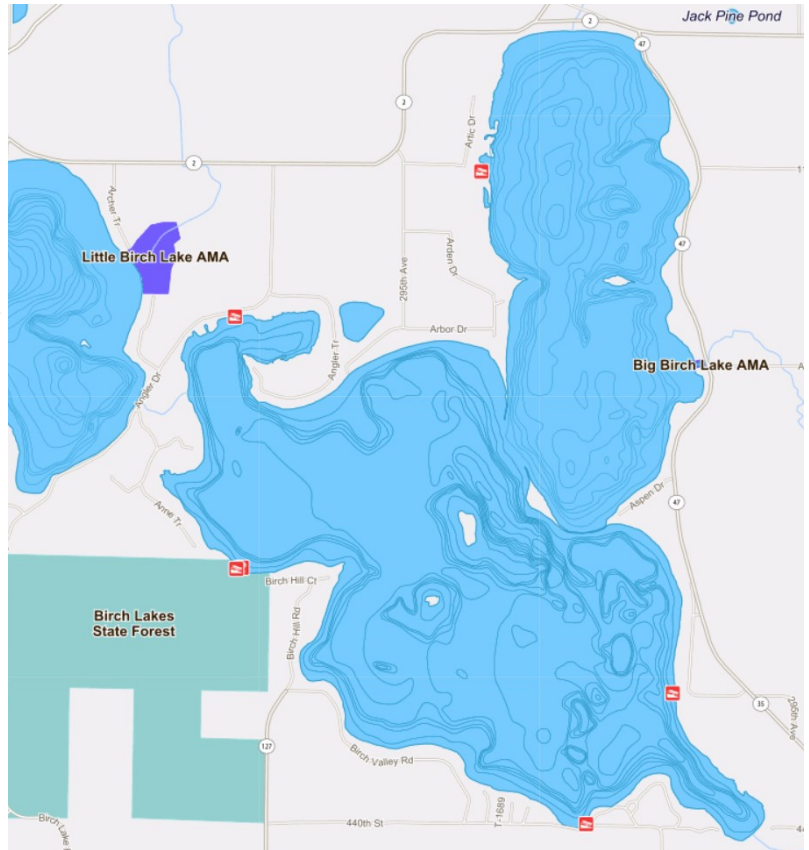


Big Birch (Todd County)

OVERVIEW

Big Birch Lake is a 2,108-acre, clear-water lake located about two miles south of Grey Eagle. It's a popular lake for fishing and recreational watercraft with five public access sites; four with concrete boat ramps. The Birch Lakes State Forest is located on the west side of the lake and offers public recreation opportunities including a campground, fishing pier and swimming beach. On-lake activity can be busy during summer weekends and holidays, but quiet fishing experiences can also be found during the week. Lakeshore residential development is moderate to heavy however the lake retains a natural feel and there are occasional stretches of private and publicly-owned shoreline that provide natural aesthetic scenery. BBL has been infested with Zebra Mussels since 2016, and precautions should be taken to prevent the spread any further.
