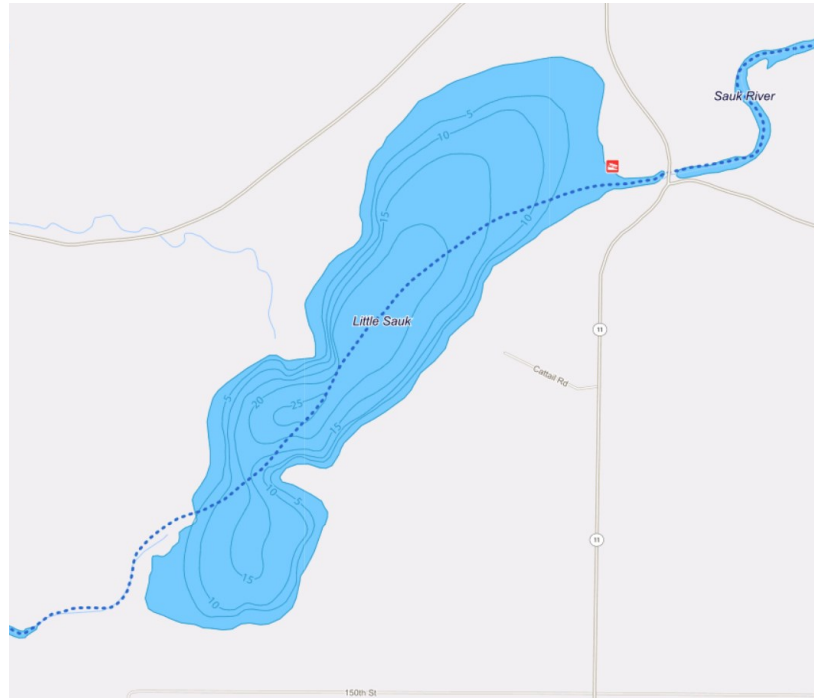


Little Sauk (Todd County)

OVERVIEW

Little Sauk Lake is part of the Sauk River system and influenced by the predominately agricultural watershed of cultivated crops and pastures. The lake has water quality problems resulting from land use practices and the presence of carp in the lake. The secchi disk reading was 3.7 feet in mid-August while in 1997 the reading was 6 feet. Along with the decrease in water clarity since the last survey, there was a corresponding decrease in aquatic plant diversity and distribution. Fewer emergent and submergent plants were found around the lake in the 2009

survey. Cattail was the most abundant species found while doing the survey and it appears to be more abundant than in 1997. Most of the emergent species were located in less than a foot of water. Sand was the most common shallow water substrate.

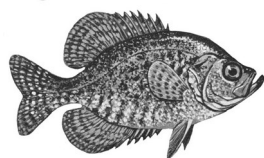
