

Long (Higgins) (Todd County)

OVERVIEW

Long Lake is a small, scenic lake in Todd County northeast of Big Sauk Lake that has many desirable features. The lake has light to moderate development, a wooded shoreline, good water clarity, and it supports a diverse fish community. There is a public access on the northwest side of the lake. The lake occasionally experiences high water levels due to the presence of two inlets but no outlet. Sand was the most common shallow water substrate around the lake. Flat-stem pondweed and white-stem pondweed were the most common submergent vegetation and grew out to a depth of 18 feet. Curly-leaf pondweed is present in the lake and was more noticeable to lakeshore owners this year.

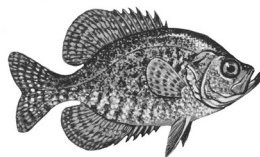
