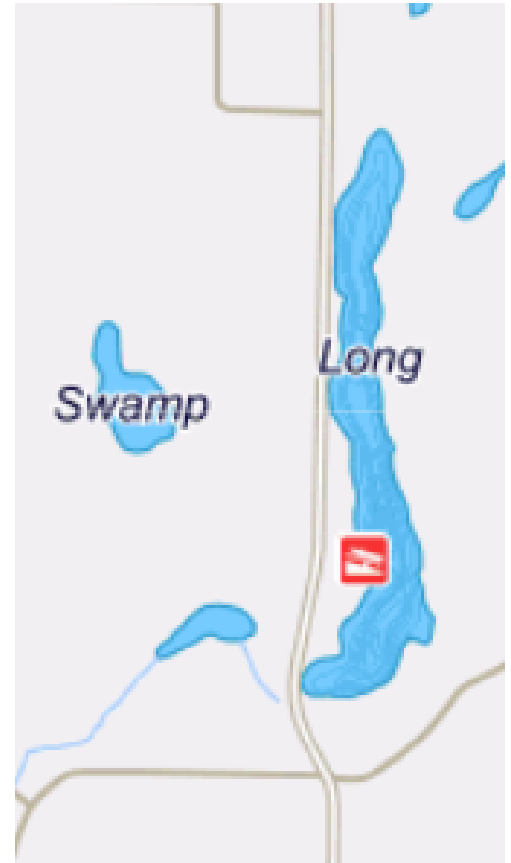
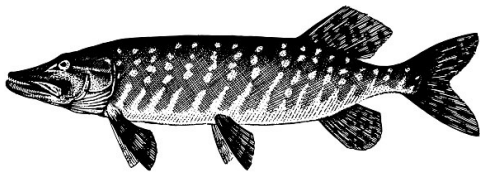


# Long - St. Rosa (Stearns County)

## OVERVIEW

Long Lake is located in Stearns County, one mile south of St. Rosa. The lake has a surface area of 92 acres and a maximum depth of 65 feet. The watershed is large and dominated by agriculture. There are few homes on the lake, but a large area along shore has steep banks and is grazed by cattle, causing erosion. Water quality is moderate and the lake has a modest number of aquatic plant species; coontail, chara, and sago pondweed were the most common species. Plants grew to a maximum depth of 13 feet. Curly-leaf pondweed is an invasive plant found at or near the surface in three percent of the lake area at the end of May. Northern pike, walleye, largemouth bass, bluegill, black crappie, and yellow perch are present in the lake. A public access is located on the west side of the lake.
