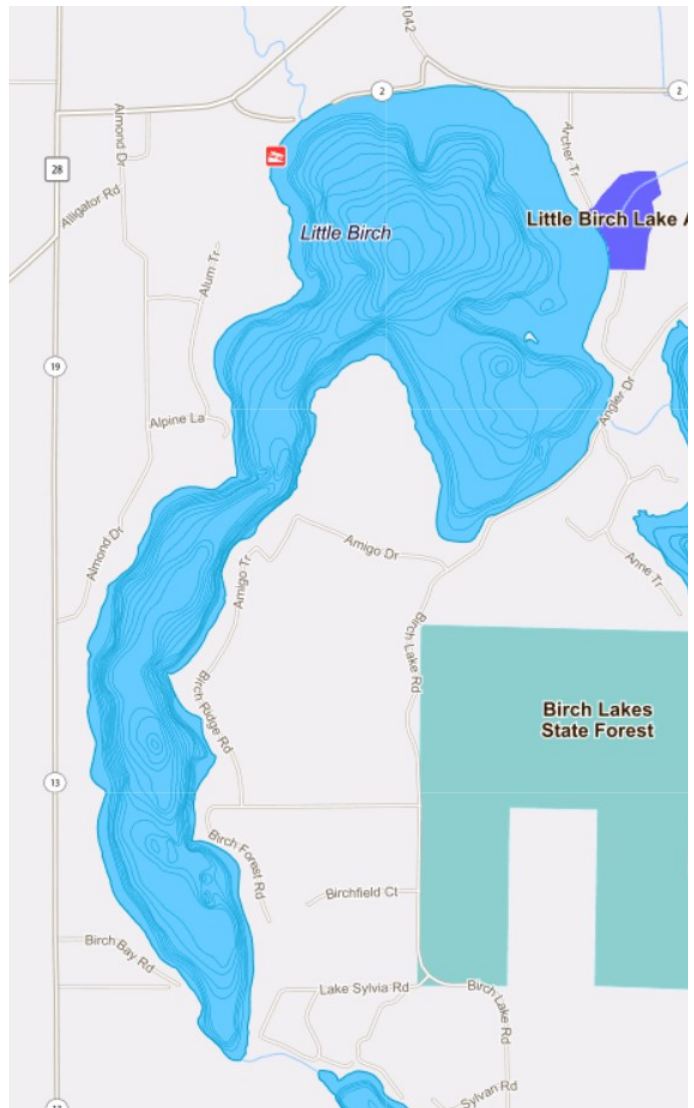


Little Birch (Todd County)

OVERVIEW

Little Birch Lake is an 840-acre waterbody located three miles southwest of Grey Eagle. The lake is impaired by the presence of zebra mussels and Eurasian Watermilfoil, however it retains its reputation as one of the nicer lakes in the area and is a popular fishing and recreational-boating lake with good water quality and clarity. Aquatic plants are abundant and highly diverse including extensive areas of submerged, emergent, and floating-leaf plants. Much of the lake however is characterized by a steep drop-off from which densely vegetated areas disappear quickly to deep water. The shoreline is mostly wooded and residential development is well established. Shallow-water bottom substrates range from sand and gravel to muck. The lake is managed primarily for Walleye and secondarily for Northern Pike, Smallmouth Bass and Largemouth Bass. Due to the presence of aquatic invasive species including zebra mussels and Eurasian Watermilfoil, anglers are reminded to drain all water from boats, livewells and trailers and be sure all aquatic plants are removed before leaving the access.
