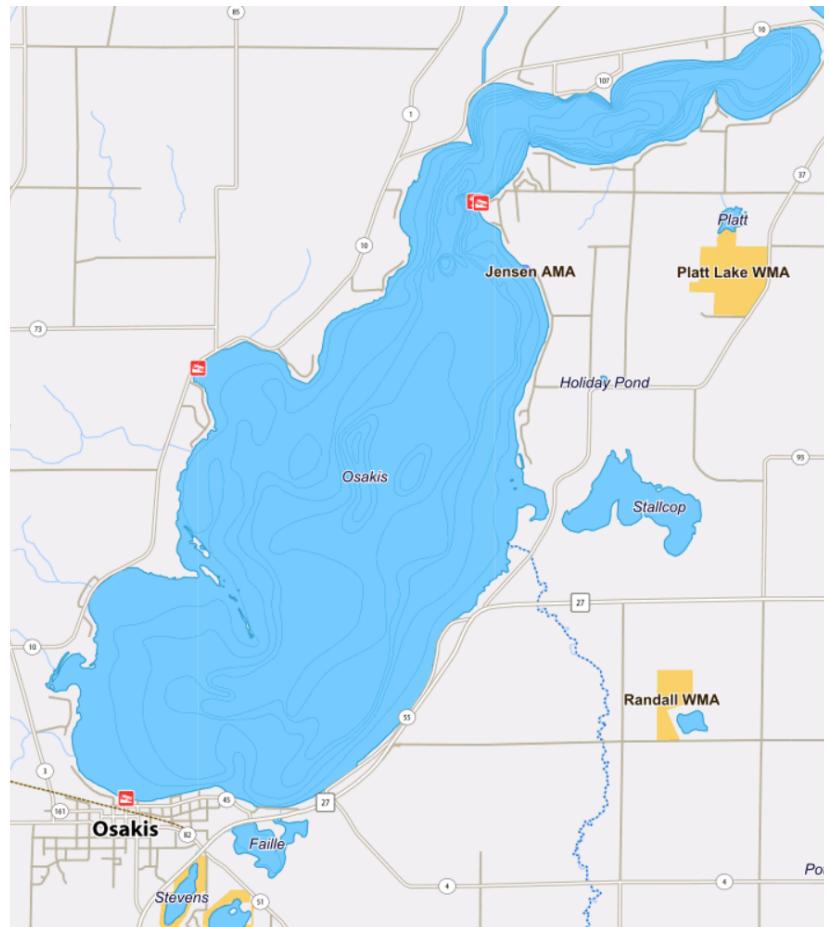


Osakis Lake (Todd County)

OVERVIEW

Lake Osakis is a nutrient-rich, highly productive basin located in both Douglas and Todd counties. Lake Osakis is the headwaters of the Sauk River. Due to high nutrient levels, water quality can be seasonally impaired with periodic algal blooms and low water clarity (< 3.5 feet). Lake Osakis supports a diverse fish community and robust fishery in part due to a variety of fish habitats that include large, expansive bulrush beds, mid-lake flats, and rock bars. Lake Osakis was designated as an infested water after the discovery of zebra mussels in 2017. Recreational users should take necessary precautions to prevent further spread of invasive species. Drain all water and remove all aquatic vegetation from your boat and trailer when leaving any body of water .
