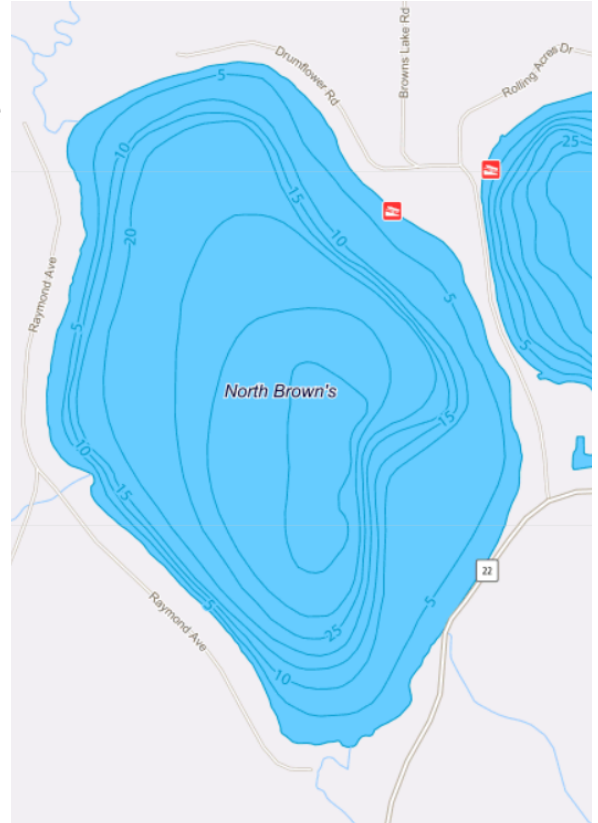


North Brown's (Stearns County)

OVERVIEW

North Brown's is a 324 acre lake located five miles north of Eden Valley in southern Stearns County. It has a maximum depth of 41 feet and a large watershed dominated by agriculture (64%) and pasture (20%). A public access is located on the northeast end of the lake. It is the third in a series of lakes that outlet to the Sauk River Chain of Lakes.

The immediate watershed of North Brown's Lake is 4,000 acres, although the lake also receives inputs from Eden and Mud Lakes, which have a watershed of 24,000 acres. Water clarity is typically greater than ten feet during spring, but declines over summer. Submersed plants were found growing as deep as 8.5 feet, but the overall plant community was not very diverse. Coontail and Canada waterweed were the most common plant species found. Curly-leaf pondweed was found growing over much of the shallow area of the lake.

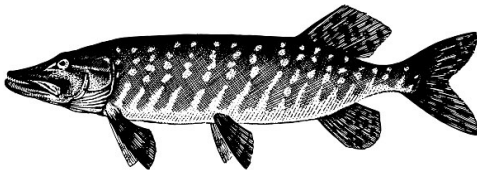
