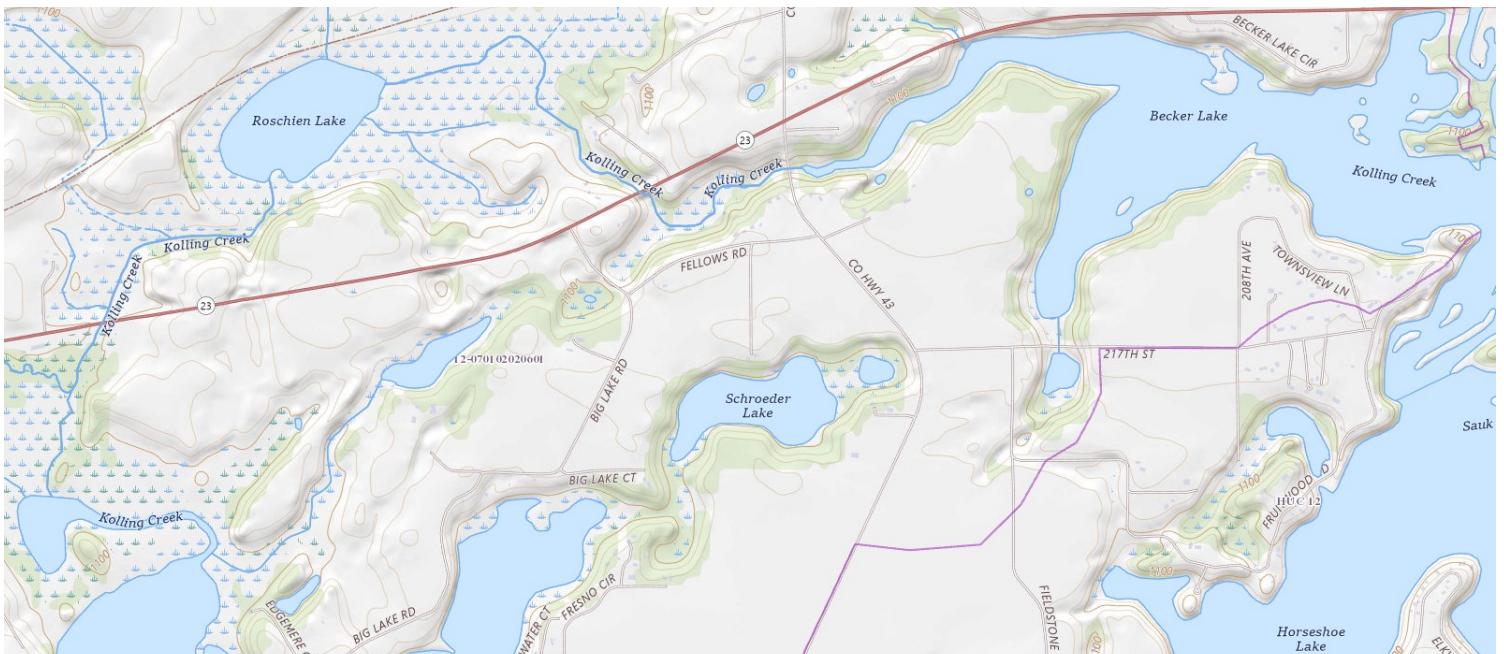


Kolling Creek

OVERVIEW

Kolling Creek is a general warm water stream that is found south of Richmond, which is in south-eastern Stearns County. That also means this creek is near the Sauk River Chain of Lakes system (also known as Horseshoe Chain of Lakes). This creek begins at the outlet of Big Lake, found on the north side of the lake. It then flows NE through some wetland areas until reaching Roschien Lake. Continuing from there, Kolling travels east for about 1.3 miles until it outlets into Becker Lake. When the water reaches this point, it is now a part of the Chain of Lakes system.

As seen on the MPCA Water Quality Dashboard, Kolling was listed as impaired for dissolved oxygen in 2009. As far as the recreational use, it is suitable for swimming and wading with low bacteria levels throughout open water season. It may not always support a thriving fish community. The SRWD does not currently monitor Kolling Creek, but there is water quality data available on the MPCA portal.
