

Fish Creek

OVERVIEW

Fish Creek is a warmwater stream in southeast Todd County near the Stearns County border. Fish Creek begins at the outlet of Goose Lake near Grey Eagle. It travels less than 2 miles SW before ending at the inlet of Big Birch Lake.

According to the MN Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), 35.5% of the creek's watershed is agricultural (row crop, pasture). Additionally, rangeland occupies 32.4% of the drainage area. The Fish Creek drainage area has a low proportion of agricultural use in comparison to waterbodies in the watershed. Fish Creek has not been actively monitored by the SRWD since 2013, but was assessed for aquatic life in 2018. The aquatic life assessment in 2018 gave a fish index of biological integrity (IBI) of 30 (Poor) and invertebrate IBI as 62 (Good). Following the assessment, the creek was quantified as "Good" for aquatic life. Details of results and what species were present can be found on the MPCA Surface Water site, linked below.
