

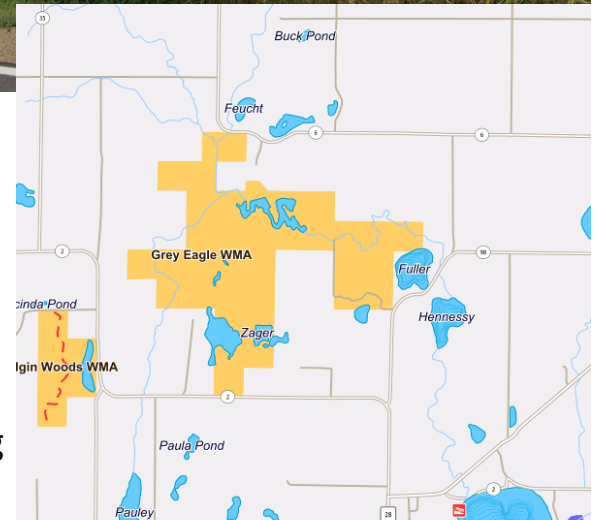
Grey Eagle WMA

OVERVIEW

The Grey Eagle Wildlife Management Area (WMA) sits 3 miles west of Grey Eagle on CR 98. The WMA is composed of rolling hills filled with oak woods and old grass fields. In the lowland areas, you can find a variety of small wetlands with two large restored wetlands on the property. The focus of the area is to maintain and improve habitat for greater diversity of native plants and animals. The greatest emphasis is on **grassland and wetland habitats**.



The environment within this WMA promotes recreational use year round. The variety of use includes hunting, trapping, hiking, cross-country skiing, snow shoeing and wildlife viewing/photography! While visiting WMAs, respect private property boundaries and ask for permission before going onto private lands. No motorized vehicles are allowed within the WMA, except on designated parking lots and routes.
