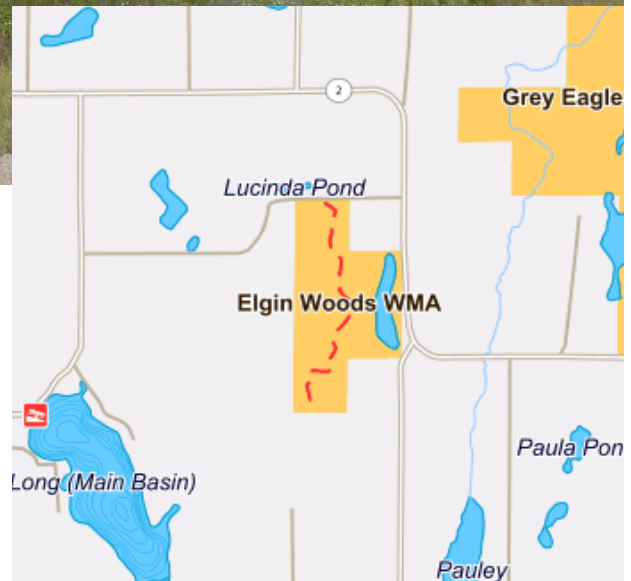


Elgin Woods WMA

OVERVIEW

The **Elgin Woods Wildlife Management Area (WMA)** sits 1.5 miles northeast of Long Lake in Birchdale Township. The WMA features a 36.14-acre open water wetland/marsh along its eastern edge. Here you can find **hardwood forest and several small wetlands**. The management focus of this WMA is maintaining and improving habitat for diversity of native species. The greatest focus for management is forest-dependent wildlife.



The landscape of Elgin Woods WMA offers **recreational opportunities year round**. Activities include hunting, trapping, hiking, wildlife viewing, cross-country skiing and snow shoeing. While visiting WMAs, respect private property boundaries and ask for permission before going onto private lands. No motorized vehicles are allowed on the WMA, except designated roads and parking lots. ATVs, OHVs, motorized watercraft, and snowmobiles are not allowed anywhere on the WMA.
