

Belle River WMA: North and South Unit

OVERVIEW

The Belle River Wildlife Management Areas (WMA) sits 3.5 miles Southeast of Carlos.

These management units have two deep water basins connected by a narrows. The North Unit has a 62 acre unnamed lake and the South Unit has a 98 acre unnamed lake.

The Hunting opportunities are mainly for waterfowl. It does have a narrow band of upland that could be used for nesting and upland hunting.

While visiting WMAs, respect private property boundaries and ask for permission before going

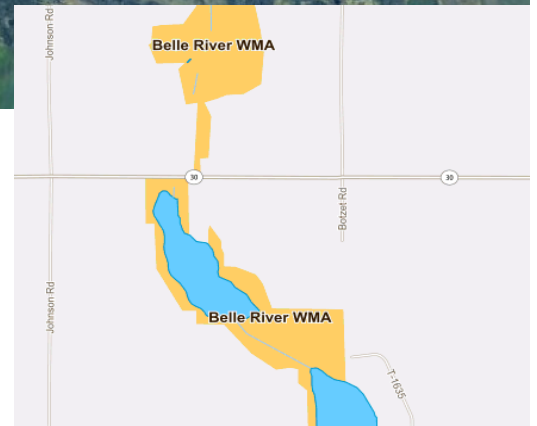
