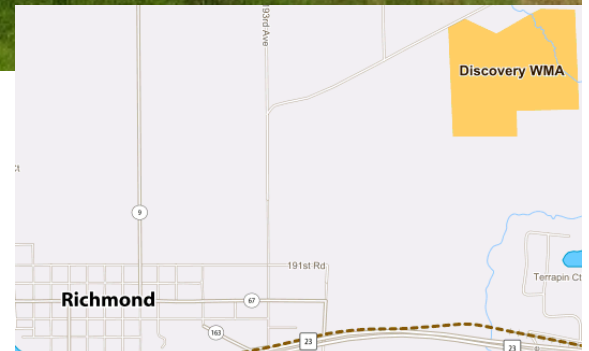


Discovery WMA

OVERVIEW

The Discovery Wildlife Management Area (WMA)

sits 2 miles Northeast of Richmond. This WMA is composed of fairly level restored prairie grasslands, shallow wetlands, and willow dominated lowlands. A small unnamed creek flows through the unit. The large amount of grassland benefits dozens of upland bird nesters.

The restored prairie grasslands have a very diverse mixture of wildflowers present. June and July are good times to view the flowering grasslands. While visiting WMAs, respect private property boundaries and ask for permission before going onto private lands.
