

Randall WMA

OVERVIEW

The Randall Wildlife Management Area (WMA) sits 4 miles northeast of Osakis on 170th St. The small WMA is located less than 0.5 miles east of the Sauk River. Randall Lake is just outside the WMA to the southeast. The landscape is wooded and features restored native grass field and adjacent cattail marsh. The management focus of this unit is to improve its woodland and grassland habitats.

Randall WMA provides opportunities for various outdoor activities. Some of the most common uses are hunting, trapping, hiking, and wildlife viewing/photography. Additional winter activities like cross-country skiing and snowshoeing are options as well! While visiting WMAs, respect private property boundaries and ask for permission before going onto private lands.

Game Species: Deer, Small Game, Pheasants, Waterfowl



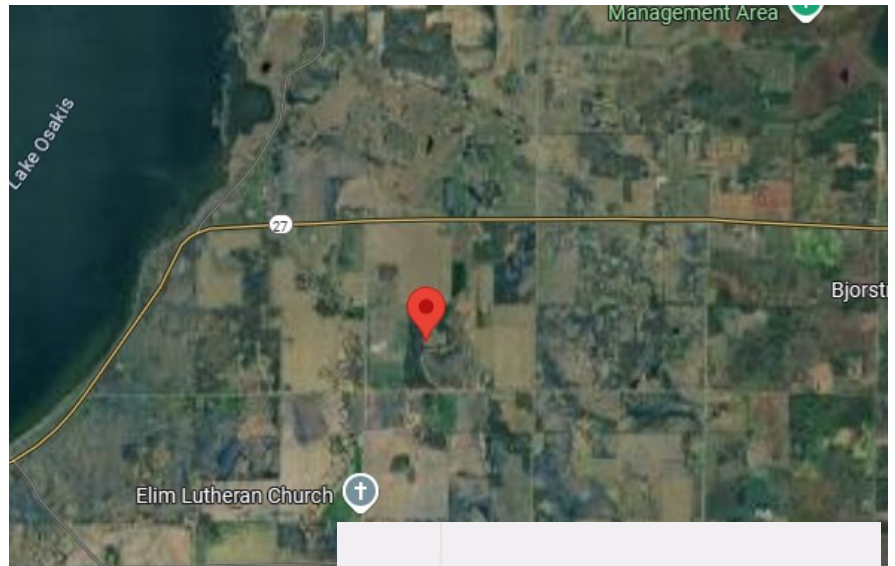
