Fiscal Agent Updates

Fy 22 & Supplemental

- Total grant budget \$1,136,821
- Sum of expenditures- \$584,550.10 (51%)
- Sum of allocations and encumbrances-\$863,753.18 (76%)
- Interest earned (unbudgeted)- \$31,405.15
- The next 40% of the grant has been requested by the fiscal agent. Schedule is 50%-40%-10%

Fy2024

- Total grant budget- \$1,212,865
- Sum of expenditures- \$ 63,607.95
- Budget remaining- \$1,081,576.87

Fiscal agent updatef the objectives from where funds were moved into the Cold Spring Dam Feasibility Study.





Draft Cost Share Funding Policy Update:

The agenda item for the collaborative agreement was to discuss and determine if partners were concerned about the timeframes for major work plan changes, which could lead to a discussion on potential solutions such as amendments to the collaborative agreement or re-evaluating the structure of the watershed group (maybe consider a JPE?). If there was interest in changing something, then it could be taken to the PC for further discussion. It is also a good reminder for the partners of the language in the signed agreement. All should know this language and follow it.

Others discussion notes from the fiscal report:


- Concerns were voiced by BWSR staff regarding meeting pollution reduction goals.
 - BWSR Staff further explained that it is a statewide trend with 1W1P groups failing to meet their initial pollution reduction. BWSR staff clarified, that while it is part of a larger trend, we need to be aware of the low progress to date.



SWCD Projects Review-

Todd SWCD- Woldvogel Gully repair- Approved

Note: The group consensus was that this project belongs under obj 11 as the bulk of the work and expenses relate to shoreline protection rather than structural AG practices.



Sauk River Chain of Lakes Cold Spring Dam Rock Arched Rapids-


