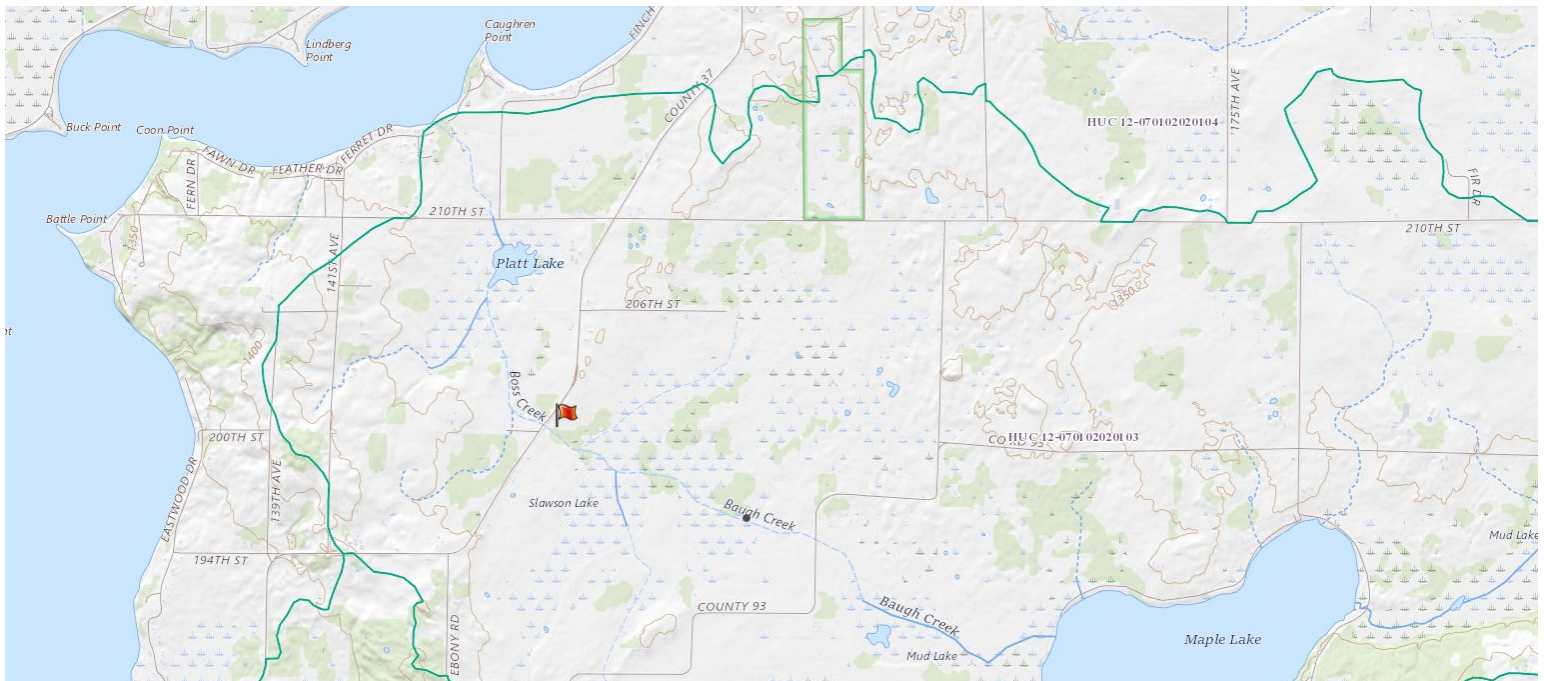


Boss Creek/Baugh Creek

OVERVIEW

Baugh Creek begins in Maple Lake in Todd County near Little Sauk. This small creek then travels 1.1 miles NW until it reaches Slawson Lake, which is really just a large wetland. It flows right through the Owen-Hinz Wildlife Management Area (WMA) that is just west of Maple Lake. Baugh Creek then becomes **Boss Creek** and travels 1 mile north until it outlets into Platt Lake, which is east of Lake Osakis. Boss Creek flows through Platt Lake WMA.

There is no surface water data for Baugh Creek, and it has not been assessed for aquatic life or recreation. Boss Creek does have surface water data available on the MPCA portal, and it has been listed as impaired for aquatic life bioassessments and dissolved oxygen. A fish Index of Biological Integrity (IBI) was conducted in 2018, and it received a score of 36 (Fair).
